MLTSD Update Julie Jeaurond, MLTSD	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Discussed the use of elastomeric respirators <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ They are used in some regions successfully, but some concerns include hard to speak with them on, seal checks, warm to wear. - Disposal of PPE; done at hospital or station for 911, Community Paramedics may dispose in patients' home. - The EMS Communiqué – PPE for Communicable Diseases will be shelved for now until such time it may be needed. - Feedback from MLTSD Legal Services Branch on the 4 GN's has been received. Based on the recommendations each of the GN's has been assigned and will be further revised/reviewed. Once completed, they will continue the approval/review process.
