2.	Welcome	Welcome to new member, Harri Hamalainen who represents OAPC and Mike Nunn who represents SEIU. John McCarthy will take over as co-chair for OAPC following the retirement of Wayne Markell.
3.	Minutes of previous meeting	Minutes of the previous meeting (May 31/June 1, 2023) were presented and accepted, as amended.

Update from MOH Donald Pierce Manager, MOH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) Don has changed roles and is now Senior Field Manager for Eastern Region, Central East Field Office (A). b) CAD 5 – Every centre is on except Parry Sound. c) MPDS update – pressure from Association of Municipalities to have their centre next. Kenora (Nov.) and Thunder Bay (Jan.) then to Ottawa (April) and Renfrew. Then Georgian CACC in Barrie in Winter 2024 followed by Kingston, then Lindsay. d) Telephony system – Now is 5 centres, Cambridge is next. Will support the CACC's in the process of going to NG911 and that is set for 2025. e) PSRN – Public Service Radio Network. A lack of radios, pause until vendor can come up with resources required. 3-4 month pause on training until further notice. f) Real Time Data – called Unit Status View now, getting ready to be release. MCAD deployment coming shortly. g) Hiring at CACC – 188 seats offered, 157 completed (record). Accepted 220 seats this year for ACO's. Health and Human Resources and keeping people working is an on-going challenge. h) Concerns about portable radio testing taking place in another location on an admin. channel. i) Is there a plan to deal with turnover of CACC's? Yes, working with OPSEU.

Putting in a plan to mandate training for supervisors while others are on vacation.• Looking to build a second central base in western division.• Last meeting/work duty as a Paramedic in Ontario. <p><u>Harri Hamalainen:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Just hired 6 new medics, trying to get auto-pulses, new uniforms.• Going into other regions, crew could be gone an extra 45 minutes.• Trying to figure out solution to having response truck in the yard all winter. <p><u>John McCarthy:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Medics in the northern region are stretched thin, sometimes working alone.• No more on-call base.• Community Paramedicine is poaching staff.• Violence calls have increased, PTSD claims are up. <p><u>Mike Nunn:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Works mostly fixed wing out of Thunder Bay• Communities in the north are without proper transportation, parts and mechanic to work on vehicles nearly impossible. Looking for more suitable options.• Using a #9 stretcher put into an SUV.• Rollout for new ambulances is slow.• Provided contact info for Rob Crossan. <p><u>Ian Nash:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Issues with mental health, things are not moving quickly.• Conference upcoming, discussions around suicide prevention, signs and symptoms for all workers.• Ontario Paramedic Monument, close to getting charity status.• Just put 3 new trucks on the road for Community Paramedicine. Doing mostly Code 3's to try to free up emergency rooms.• Had a needle stick injury recently.• Staffing is an issue. Looking for a new Chief.• Discussion around the changes from a 2-year to a 3-year Paramedic training program. <p><u>Dave Doran:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Concerns w/ACO's and amount of radiation exposure from the consoles at dispatch centres.• Staffing issues with Wolfe Island Ferry. Medics having to go with Coast Guard. Patient transfer plan needs to be implemented. Concerns with Fire Services transporting patients.• Air quality in the stations.• Safe injection sites and tent cities in same vicinity.																																																

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PAPR's on each vehicle. • Trying to get tow ropes on ambulances. • No standardization for ambulance cleaning. • Radon testing taking place in a couple stations. One station was elevated and steps being taken to mitigate. • Concerns with transportation of I.V. pumps to hospital. • Lack of resources and long response times continues to be a concern. <p><u>Colin Heise:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Over 450 staff and 320 Paramedics. • Off-load delays (some approaching 30 hours), struggling with Code 0's. • Human resources challenges. • Launching Rapid Response Unit that will take code critical calls in London. • Looking to recruit Commander. • Experiencing huge population growth/call demand, affecting budgets. • Mental stress injuries are high. • WPV from patients is on the rise, doing joint project with OPSEU. Starting self-defence and scene de-escalation techniques. • Have received approval for multi-site Joint Health and Safety Committee. • Started sub-group of WPV, 4 members from JHSC. • Early Intervention Program with Western University – any medic who gets a critical call automatically goes to see a counselor, has been going very well.
